
The Nicene Creed

through him all things were made.**




**For us and for our salvation


The gifts of God for the people of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

The priest invites the people to receive communion with an attitude of humble gratitude and faith


All baptized Christians are welcome and encouraged to take Communion. If you are not baptized and are interested in being baptized, let us know.

If you do not wish to receive Communion, we invite you to come forward, cross your arms, and receive a blessing.


