

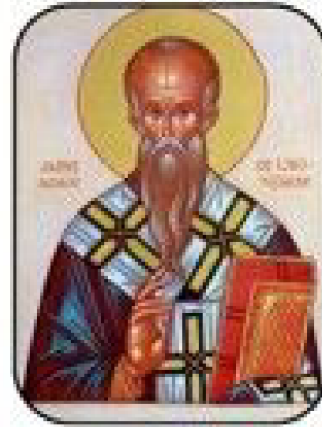
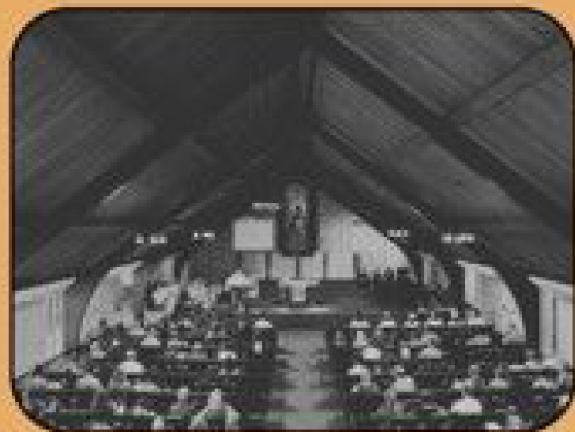
Beyond "Spiritual But Not Religious"

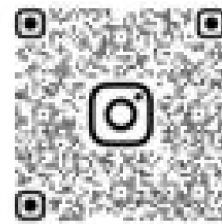

The Heart of the Fellowship

The **St. Aidan Fellowship** is a theological, scriptural, and spiritual formation program for emerging adults ages 22–35 in San Diego who desire to be deeply formed in Jesus Christ.

The Fellowship brings together a cohort for 10 months (August–May) to share a common life.

St. Aidan Fellows vow to practice and live a Rule of Life together, anchored in *The Book of Common Prayer (2019)*.

Inspired by St. Aidan of Lindisfarne, this rule is lived out across three core pillars:

HOLY EUCHARIST | PARISH

Worshipping the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in Word and Sacrament

DAILY OFFICE | CHAPEL

Sanctifying the day through corporate morning prayer and contemplation of the Scriptures

DEVOTIONS | STUDY

Forming the mind, instilling holy habits, and cultivating virtue and wisdom in Christ

Word and Sacrament in the Parish

Theological Study

A weekly seminar and reading cohort exploring the classics of the Christian tradition:

- **Patristic:** St. Athanasius, St. Augustine, and St. Benedict of Nursia
- **Medieval:** Julian of Norwich, St. Thomas Aquinas, and Dante
- **Reformation:** Thomas Cranmer, John Jewel, and George Herbert
- **Modern:** C.S. Lewis, Evelyn Underhill, and James K.A. Smith

Who was St. Aidan?

Among other evidences of holy life, Aidan gave his clergy an inspiring example of self-discipline and continence, and the highest recommendation of his teaching to all was that he and his followers lived as they taught.

St. Aidan of Lindisfarne was an Irish monk who evangelized Northumbria in the 7th century by founding numerous churches, monasteries, and schools—including a formation center for future missionaries and clergy on Lindisfarne. His life left an indelible mark on English Christianity. St. Aidan and his disciples:

- Contemplated the Scriptures,
- Chanted the Psalms,
- Fasted and served the poor,
- Provided education,
- Trained ministers,
- Celebrated the Holy Eucharist
